**Sponsor:** This award is sponsored by the Equity Advisory Committee (“EAC”) of the San Francisco Human Rights Commission (“HRC”). EAC is charged with alerting and making timely recommendations on human rights-related issues affecting the citizens of San Francisco, including issues related to equity for all of San Francisco’s diverse communities. Each year, through the HERO Awards, EAC recognizes community leaders and organizations that have enhanced their respective communities through promoting and advancing human rights for all people.

**Eligibility:** This award is available to any organization that has made an outstanding contribution to the promotion and protection of civil rights in San Francisco. This can be exemplified in the following ways:

- Involvement and leadership in assisting people to exercise their constitutional right to vote;
- Significant contribution in the field of civil rights, including guarding against discrimination in public accommodations;
- Been on forefront of causes working to ensure and protect constitutional rights in public education;
- Maintained a sustained commitment and given exceptional service to preventing discrimination in federally assisted programs;
