Join us for a panel discussion with Project Rebound and others who are working on supporting policies that are happening in California around Occupational Licensing and the re-entry population.

Jason Bell is the Regional Director of Project Rebound and a lecturer at San Francisco State University in sociology, criminal justice, and counseling.

Project Rebound was started in 1967 by Professor John Irwin and is staffed by students and post-graduating students, all of whom have had prior incarceration experiences. They are a special admissions program assisting formerly incarcerated individuals wanting to enter San Francisco State University (SFSU), and most recently 8 additional CSUs throughout the state. The program offers special admissions for men and women who might not normally qualify for university acceptance because of application deadlines and/or socio-economic obstacles that come with being formerly incarcerated. The program is supported by the Associated Students Inc., and has the support of other departments at SFSU.
